Staff Report

Central Hastings Support Network experienced a year of change as well as growth towards our mission of improving the quality of life for so many in need in our community.

Helping Hands Program – Weekly pick-ups of food from Kawartha Food Share have increased supplies of year-round fresh produce. With regular supplies of other perishable items such as cheese and yoghurt arriving weekly, clients are able to benefit from a choice of more diverse and nutritional items.

Volunteer training sessions were well attended with a focus on the ‘Raving Fans’ program as well as Violence and Harassment training.

The Volunteer Income Tax Program continued to see clients throughout the year, meaning 150 individuals and families received over \$500,000 in tax credits and benefits by ensuring their tax returns were submitted.

Volunteer Driver Program – Sheila Johnson continues to oversee this program and deal with the daily challenges. With the addition of 5 drivers in Belleville we are able to provide a cost effective and efficient service to clients on ODSP, OW and several other funders, throughout the Central Hastings area and beyond.

Financials – Our year end March 2016 showed an excess of revenues over expenditures of **\$32,018**. Audited financial statements are available.

Community Relations Team – The new website was published earlier in the year with the expertise and assistance of Jordan Bacon.

Templates for media releases and an advertising strategy for each fundraiser have been established and will continue to be developed with a focus on additional staff training.

Fundraising Activities – Three main annual fundraisers, the “Food for Thought” Art Show, “It’s a Spring Thing” Fashion Show and the “Whole Darn Town of Madoc Yard Sale”, all in their 5th year, are now well established in the community and continue to raise awareness for our organization as well as much needed funds. “Cram the Cruiser” food drives, 50/50 draws, and the Christmas Sharing campaign also support our fundraising efforts with both financial and ‘in kind’ donations.



Administration/Hub Activities – Renovations continued this year with the installation of the accessible bathroom on the main level, which replaced the existing bathroom and storage closet. Signage for the tenants was completed and a wonderful mural by Jean McDonnell completed the cheerful welcome to Food Bank entrance.

The ‘Raving Fans’ program was introduced to the organization, based on the book by Ken Blanchard with a focus on improvement of customer service. ‘Customers’ were identified – including food bank clients, transit riders, volunteers, board members and staff. They were then surveyed by questionnaire, with a focus on improving our relationships with those we work with (paid and volunteer) as well as those we serve. Any areas requiring improvement have been addressed with action plans.

Staff changes following the announcement of the retirement of Managing Director Jean McDonnell were carefully managed by the hiring committee. Jane McCulloch as Food Bank Coordinator and Linda McLaren as Office Administrator were appointed in the summer, **allowing Sally a smooth transition to spend time training with Jean before her departure.**

Vi Markov was appointed as a new part time Transit Driver on the retirement of Mel Johnson who had been with us since the start of the Transit program in 2009. We also welcomed Debbie Dunscombe as our new Janitor.

We wish to express our sincere gratitude for the unwavering support of the Board of Directors and we pledge to give them insight into our trials and rewards, and to provide our Board with any assistance they may require.
